 <p>Wild Bergamot</p>	Late summer bloomer. Butterfly attractor. Recommended for lake/streamside	2 – 3' tall	Full sun	Dry to moist Flood and drought tolerant
 <p>Smooth Blue Aster</p>	Valuable late summer bloomer for butterflies and pollinators	1 – 2' tall	Full, Partial	Dry - Moist
 <p>Wild sweet William, Meadow phlox</p>	June, July, August	2 -3' tall	Full, Partial	Moist Well drained
 <p>White Beardtongue</p>	Long blooming period in early summer (June – July)	1 – 3' tall	Full, Partial	Dry – Moist Well drained

 <p>Calico Beardtongue</p>	<p>Long blooming period in early summer (June – July)</p>	<p>1 – 3' tall</p>	<p>Full, Partial</p>	<p>Needs moist for full sun.</p>
 <p>Culver's Root</p>	<p>June, July, August bloomer</p>	<p>4 -5' tall</p>	<p>Full, Partial</p>	<p>Moist to wet</p>
 <p>Jewelweed "Touch me not"</p>	<p>June – Sept bloomer. Blooms at lake – easy to transplant</p>	<p>2 – 5' tall</p>	<p>Full, Partial</p>	<p>Wet, Medium-Wet, Medium</p>
 <p>Joe-Pye Weed</p>	<p>Mid-late summer bloomer. Good for butterflies and pollinators. Is on the lake -</p>	<p>3 – 5' tall</p>	<p>Full, Partial</p>	<p>Moist Flood tolerant</p>
 <p>Monkey Flower</p>	<p>Blooms for about 4 weeks mid summer</p>	<p>2'</p>	<p>Full, Partial</p>	<p>Moist – likes swampy</p>
 <p>Prairie Blazing Star</p>	<p>blooms in July, August, and September. It makes an excellent cut flower.</p>	<p>4'</p>	<p>Full, Partial</p>	<p>Wet, Medium-Wet, Medium</p>

 <p>Turtlehead</p>	<p>July, August, September</p>	<p>5'</p>	<p>Full</p>	<p>Wet, Medium-Wet</p>
 <p>Prairie Goldenrod</p>	<p>Larger, flatter flower clusters than most Goldenrods. Leaves turn nice shades of red in the fall.</p> <p>Often blamed for hayfever. This is not true. Their pollen is large, sticky and cannot become airborne and can never make its way into your sinuses.</p>	<p>4'</p>	<p>Full, Partial</p>	<p>Medium-Wet, Medium, Medium-Dry, Dry</p>
 <p>Prairie Smoke</p>	<p>Blooming in spring to early summer.</p>	<p>8" (low)</p>	<p>Full, Partial</p>	<p>Medium-Wet, Medium, Medium-Dry, Dry – well drained if wet</p>

 <p>Flowering Spurge</p>	<p>six weeks in mid- to late summer, plants are bowed by numerous blossoms, which have yellow centers ringed by five white petals with a touch of green near the center</p>	<p>3'</p>	<p>Wet, Medium-Wet, Medium</p>	<p>Medium, Medium-Dry, Dry</p>
 <p>Columbine</p>	<p>One of the first plants to provide nectar in the spring for bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds. The colorful flowers are red flowing into yellow.</p>	<p>2'</p>	<p>Full, Partial, Shade</p>	<p>Medium, Medium-Dry, Dry</p>
 <p>Swamp Verbena</p>	<p>Recommended for lake/streamside</p>	<p>5'</p>	<p>Wet, Medium-Wet, Medium</p>	<p>Wet, Medium-Wet, Medium</p>
